INDIANA LEGAL HELP KIOSK (COMING SOON)

The kiosks provide a way for Hoosiers to easily
access IndianaLegalHelp.org, a Foundation
program connecting Hoosiers to legal resources
and services. The IndianaLegalHelp.org website,
which has seen over one million visits since its
launch, includes legal forms, instructional
videos, referrals to free and low-cost legal
services, and a statewide calendar of free legal
advice clinics.

The IndianaLegalHelp.org kiosks will initially
focus on serving Hoosiers facing eviction or
housing instability and will expand to include
other legal topics later next year.

HOUSEKEEPING JOB AVAILABLE

We are looking for a housekeeper who will be able to attend to the library facilities with dependability, responsibility, integrity, and attention to detail. Our goal is to maintain a clean, safe, healthy, and comfortable environment for our patrons and staff.

Responsibilities include: sweeping, mopping, vacuuming, emptying waste baskets, taking out trash, cleaning and sanitizing restrooms, as well as taking care of other needs that may arise, and making sure all rooms are cared for and inspected according to standards. Housekeepers will also keep track of stocking levels of all consumables and reporting in a timely manner so that replacements can be ordered to arrive before needed. Housekeepers will take care of the cleaning equipment, reporting immediately any damages or problems with the equipment or the facility.

Requirements: More than anything, a good housekeeper must be dependable, trustworthy, detail-oriented, honest, hard-working, and reliable. We hope that they will take pride in the library and in their work here. A housekeeper may, in some cases, need to take into account the needs of the library staff, patrons, and programs. They must be able to stand, squat, kneel, bend, and be on their feet for a few hours at a time. They need to be able to prioritize jobs and have good time management skills. Hours are flexible, but it is very much preferred that cleaning is completed after hours, before the doors open at 9 am Monday through Saturday. Experience is preferred, but not required. Must be able to work with little supervision, be customer oriented and friendly, willing to accept requests and suggestions, and to respond to situations.

Job shadowing is offered till near the end of January. Will consider individual housekeepers or housekeeping teams.
